



TIPS FOR SAVING LIKE A PRAGUE LOCAL







PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Prague's extensive public transport system can save you both time and money. It is safe, efficient and can be faster than traveling by car. A yearly all-inclusive pass costs only CZK 3,650. This pass also allows you to use the pink city bikes <u>Rekola</u> twice a day for 15 minutes!

FOOD

Avoid the city center and dine at your local cafes and pubs instead. Expect daily lunch menus with balanced meals for around CZK 150–200.

On weekends, buy fresh produce and meat at farmers markets. The best ones are at Náměstí Jiřího z Poděbrad (Wed – Sat), Kulaťák (Sat) or Náplavka (Sat). Expect a friendly atmosphere, fresh delicacies and coffee, often live music – these are also a great place to meet locals! When it comes to groceries, you can save money by shopping in bigger supermarkets rather than the "express" versions in the city center. Try Kaufland, Lidl, or Penny Market and grab a loyalty card to collect points and redeem vouchers. On-line deliveries are very popular these days, however

they are more expensive.


SECOND HAND SHOPPING




