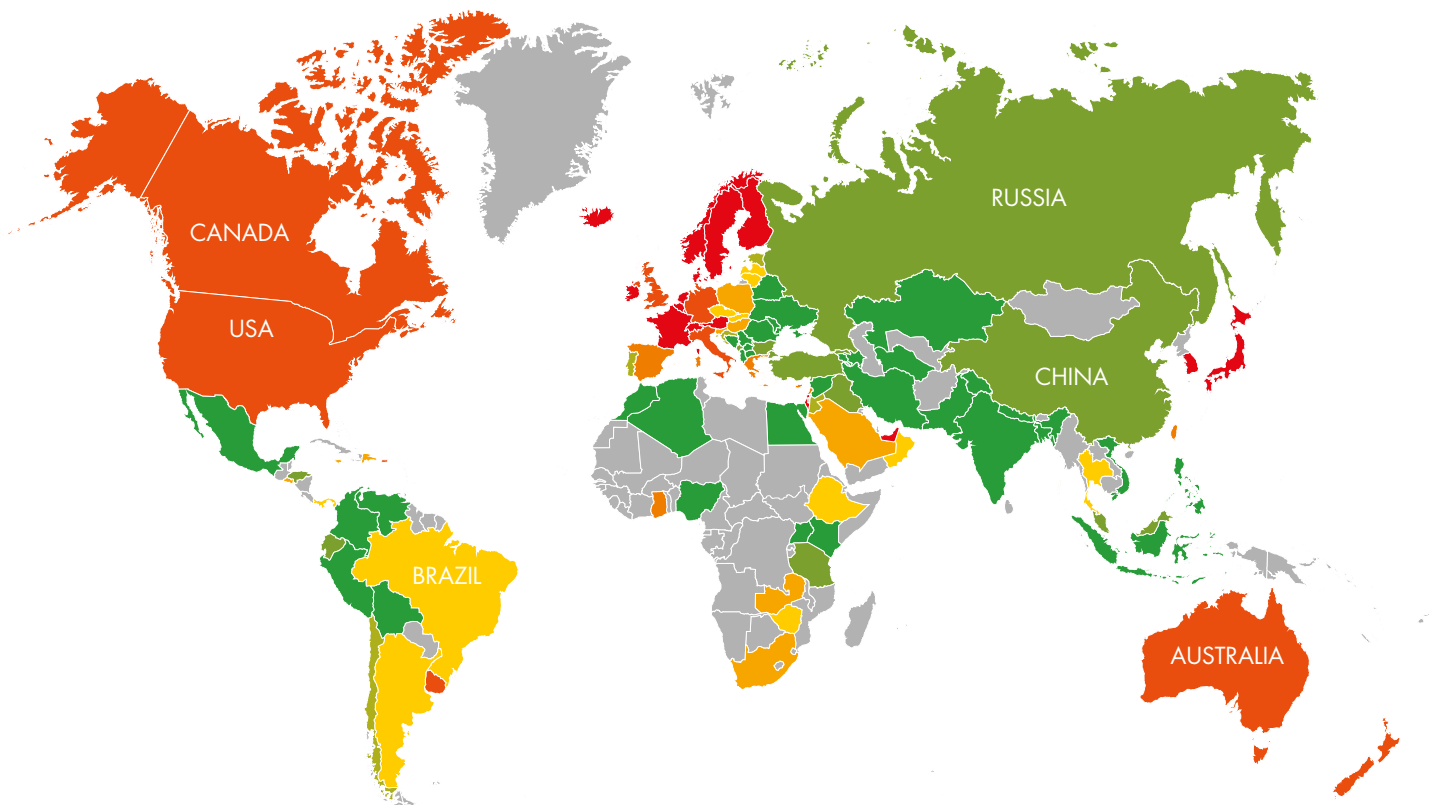

The CPI = Consumer Price Index in the infographic is a relative indicator of a country's living costs compared to New York.

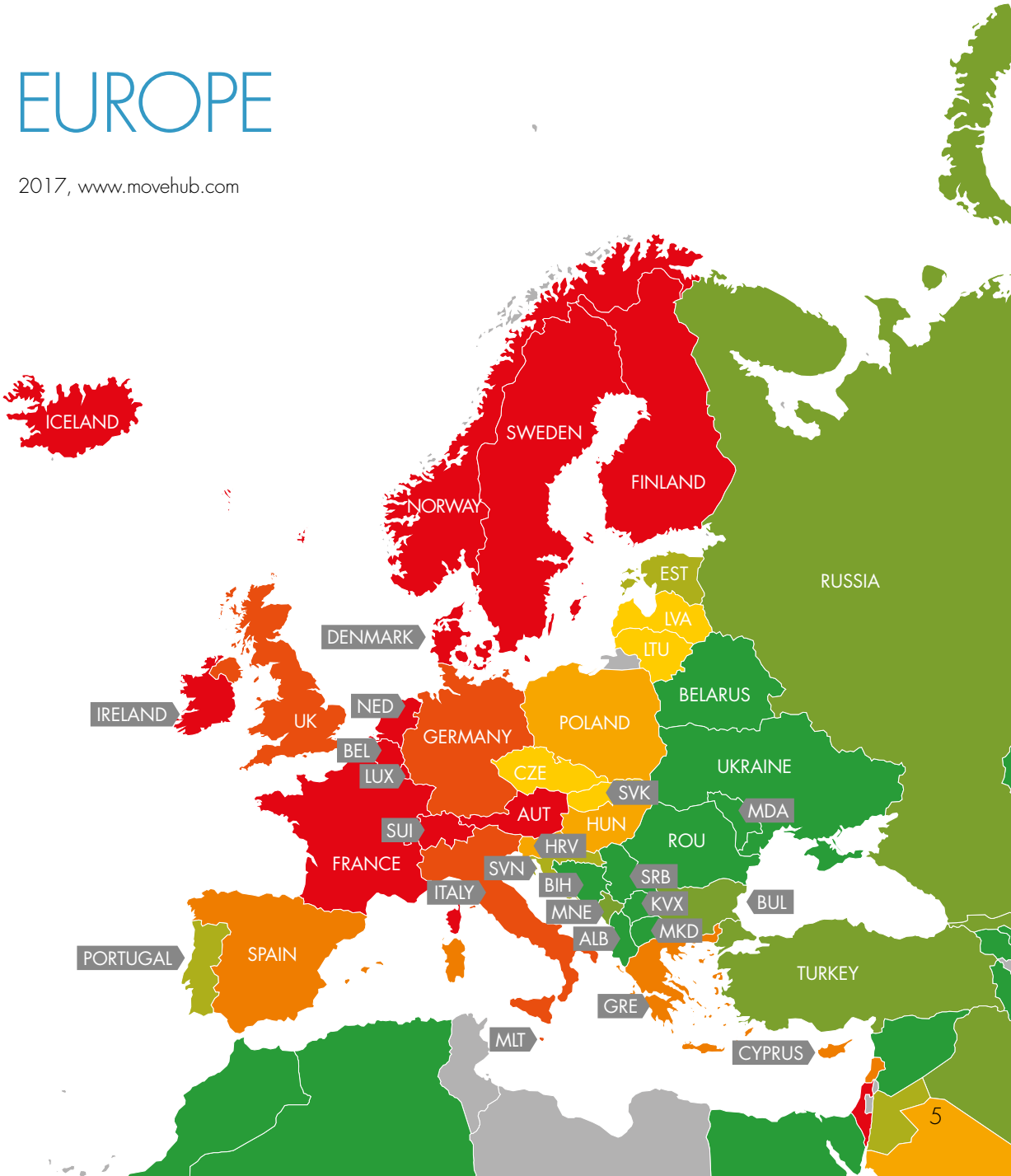

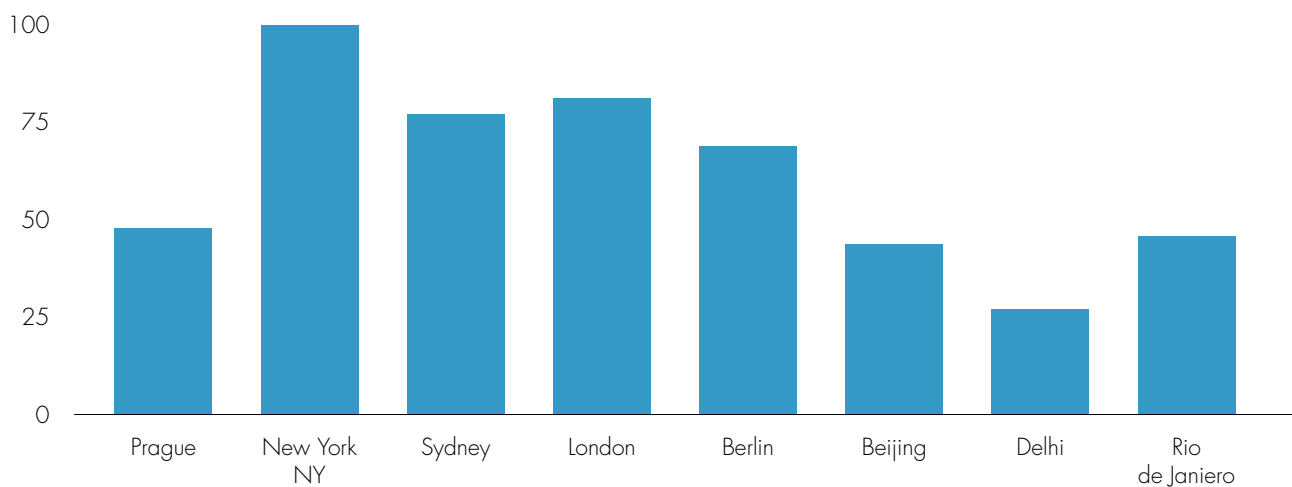

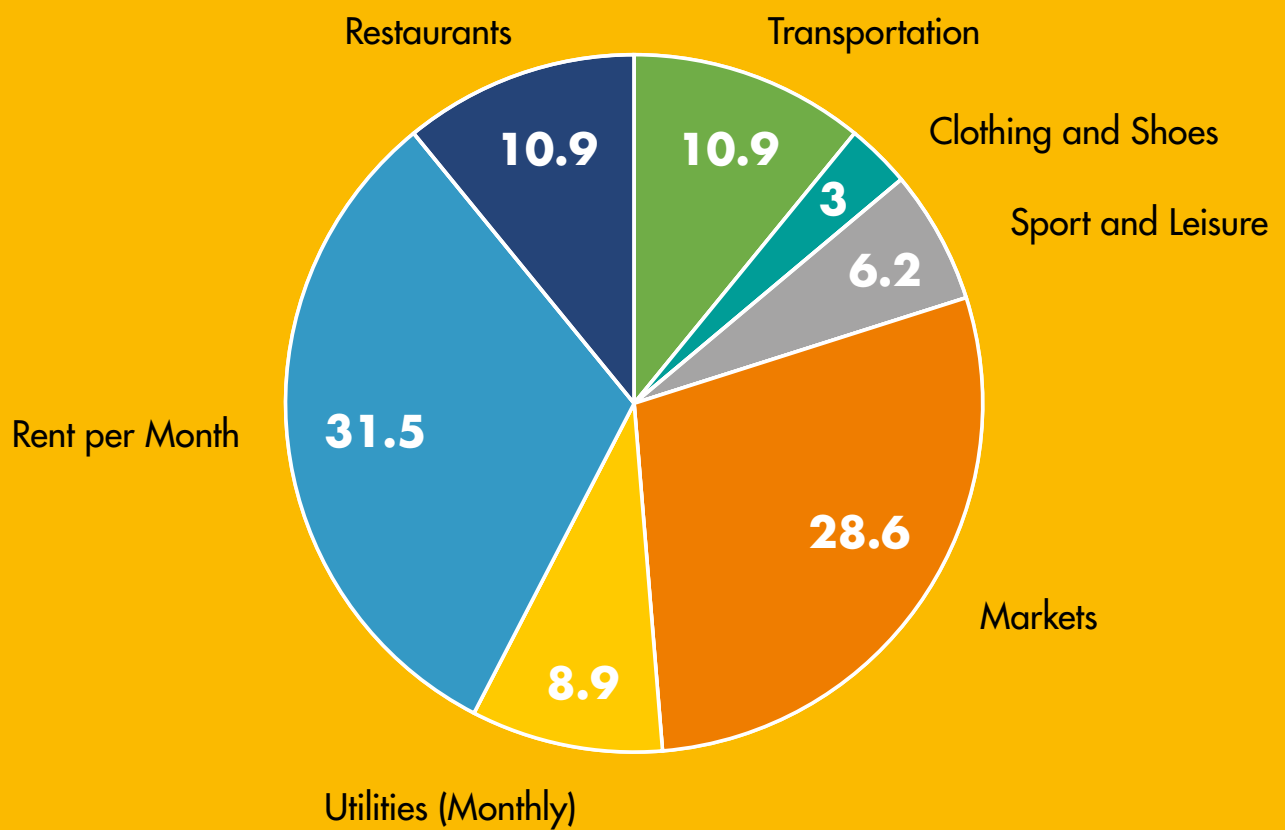
