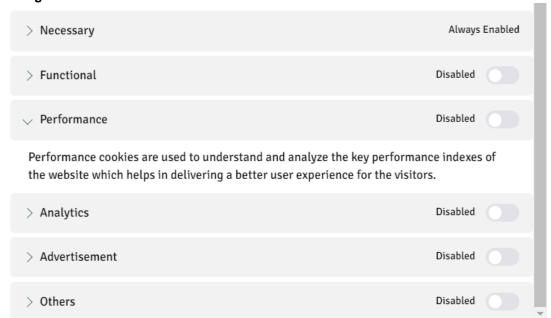
1. Categories of cookies in the cookie banner

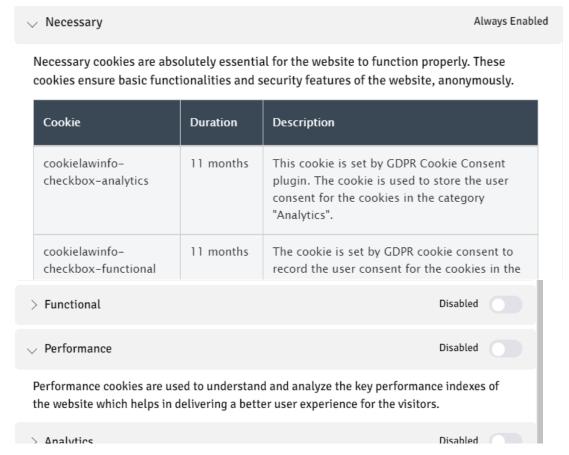


## divide into 4 main categories as follows:

- Necessary
- Preferences / Functional
- Statistics / Analytics
- Marketing

**Please note** that these categories are market standards and tools such as OneTrust categorize cookies according to the above categories.

2. Each category must contain a list of cookies according to the table in the Cookie policy. For example, the category of essential cookies contains a list of cookies, but others do not.



**Please note** that cookies should be checked, or your website provider should inform you of each new cookie implemented on your website.

## 3. Add a button to refuse all cookies to which the user can consent.

We use cookies on our website to give you the most relevant experience by remembering your preferences and repeat visits. By clicking "Accept All", you consent to the use of ALL the cookies. However, you may visit "Cookie Settings" to provide a controlled consent.







Although color design is never mentioned in neither the ePrivacy Directive nor the GDPR, the use of high and low contrasting colors is widely used in cookie banners. This is a nudging technique not explicitly illegal, but some Data Protection Authorities – like the Danish DPA – argue that if used to manipulated or mislead, it can be illegal. Please consider the color of the button - rejected, cookie settings and accept all.

4. Please edit the text in the banner about cookies and add information about the meaning of refusing cookies.

Example: We use cookies on our website to give you the most relevant experience by remembering your preferences and repeat visits. By clicking "Accept All", you consent to the use of ALL the cookies or by clicking on the "Reject ALL" button you reject all cookies except essential cookies. However, you may visit "Cookie Settings" to provide a controlled consent. For more information, please see the Cookie Policy.

- 5. Please find below an evaluation of the cookie settings in accordance with the recommendation of the Data Protection Authority:
  - cookie bar with the option to set cookies  $\sqrt{\phantom{a}}$
  - a button to easily reject all cookies x
  - consent button for technical cookies must not be  $\sqrt{\phantom{a}}$
  - clear settings for preferential cookies √
  - link to the cookie policy on the cookie bar x
  - appropriate text on the cookie bar  $\sqrt{\phantom{a}}$
  - the cookie bar must not overlap the content of the page (e.g. legal information)  $\sqrt{\phantom{a}}$
  - ability to set cookies at any time x
  - the cookie bar must not prevent access to the website and must not make access conditional on consent (cookie wall)  $\checkmark$
  - appropriate classification of cookies (deviation from the standard) x

X means that the cookie settings do not comply with the recommendation.
